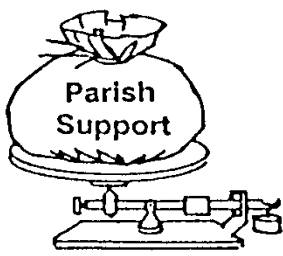



Gettysburg Soup Kitchen Ministry: Thank you to all who gave so generously to the Gettysburg Soup Kitchen in June! As the Soup Kitchen now regularly feeds 70+ people/day, it's churches and organizations like ours that provide the critical food and meal support they need to sustain this demand. The Summer months also see an uptick in the number of children being fed and many of the food items purchased focused on this need. St Rita's continues to answer the call and this month raised yet another **record total of \$2106**, including **\$1351 in food supplies, \$568 in Webstaurant food orders, PLUS \$187 in direct financial contributions!** For a relatively small parish, St Rita's is starting to make a substantial impact to this ministry.
